DOCTOR OF MEDICINE AYURVEDA

1. AIM AND OBJECT:

The aim of the Post-graduate degree course shall be the in specialties and super specialties and to produce experts specialist who can be competent and efficient teachers, clinical surgeons, pharmacists, research workers and pro- found scholars in the respective field of specialization of Ayurveda.

2. SPECIALITY IN WHICH POST-GRADUATE DEGREE IS CONDUCTED:-

Prasutitantra & streeroga and shalya tantra.

3. THE NOMENCLATURE OF POST-GRADUATE DEGREE:-

Ayurved Vachaspati MD Ayurveda (Prasutitantra & streeroga and shalya tantra)

4. Mode of Admission:

- (1) A person possessing the degree in Ayurveda of a University of Board or medical institution specified in the Second Schedule to the Act shall be eligible for admission in the Post-Graduate degree course.
- (2) The selection shall be made strictly on the basis of one common final merit index based on written test and interview on the tests of the following index:-
 - (a) Written test Index (to be calculated out of 90 Marks)
 - (b) Interview Index (to be calculated out of 10 marks)Final Index: 100 marks
- (3) The minimum marks in the final index for eligibility for admission shall be 50% (40% in the case of reserved categories)
- (4) The written test shall consist of one common written paper comprising of objective type of question covering all the subjects of Ayurveda. The details of which shall be decided by the Selection committee constituted for the purpose or laid down in the rules of the prospectus of studies.

(5) Thesis:

- (1) Before a candidate is allowed to undertake the work of thesis the title of the thesis should be registered with the University within the six months of admission and the synopsis should be approved at the end of preliminary year.
- (2) The application of registration of the title of the thesis should clearly mention the full title of the thesis with a synopsis of the proposed theme of work indicating the familiarity of the candidate with the proposed theme of work and the name of the department and the name and designation of the guide/Supervisor and co-guide.
- (3) Once the title for thesis is approved, the candidate will not be allowed to change the title or the proposed theme of work.
- (4) The registration of the candidate will be cancelled if the candidate fails to submit the title of thesis along with synopsis within the specified period as mentioned above.
- (5) No candidate shall be allowed to submit the thesis before the expiry of one calendar year registration of the title of the thesis and before six months of the final year.
- (6) The subject of the thesis must be related with the subject matter of the specialty offered by the candidate.
- (7) The thesis should place on record the methods and potentiality of the research carried out by the candidate on the problem selected by him and completed under the guidance of the teacher approved by the University.
- (8) The thesis should consist of critical survey of relevant literature, research, results of the research discussion on the basis of existing literature on

the subject, conclusion, summary of thesis and references cited in the thesis.

- (9) There will be Scrutiny Committee constituted by the University which will scrutinize and approve the title of the thesis and proposed scheme of work submitted as per rules. The subject of every thesis should be practical oriented, devoid of unpromising specialties and should be helpful in the development of service of Ayurveda.
- (10) The thesis ordinarily consist of exceeding 200 typed pages. The thesis should contain at the end a summary of not more than 1500 words covering the conclusion drawn by the candidate.
- (11) The guide/supervisor shall be a person of status of a Professor/Reader in the subject. A Professor, a Reader and a Lecturer can guide in maximum three, two and one students respectively in each academic year.
- (12) The thesis must be satisfactory as regards literary presentation and suitable for publication either as such as in a abridged form.
- (13) Four copies of the bound thesis together with one certificate from the examination.
- (14) The thesis shall be assessed by four examiners appointed by the university, two of them will be external and two internal, one of the internal.

6. PERIOD OF STUDY AND ATTENDANCE:

- (1) The candidates have to undergo a period of study for three years after admission, out of which one year shall be devoted to Preliminary course and next two years devoted to specialty course.
- (2) The students will be required to attend at least 75% of total lectures, practical separately to become eligible to appear in the examination.
- (3) The students will be required to attend the hospital and other duties as may be allotted to them during the course of study All the students will be required to do House Job duties and clinical

Registrar's duties in their respective departments during preliminary and final courses respectively.

- (4) The students will also be required to attend special lectures, demonstrations, seminars, study tours and such other activities. Which may be arranged by the teaching departments.
- (5) No relaxation in period of study shall be given to a candidate who has already obtained Post-Graduate degree Post-Graduate course in other specialty.
- (6) The teachers having a three years teaching experience can be allowed to undertake Post-Graduate training as regular candidate. No relaxation in the duration of study will be made to in service Physician/teachers.

7. Method of training:-

- (1) Intensive training will be given in classical knowledge along with comparative and critical study in the respective specialty.
- (2) The emphasis should be given on in-service training and not in didactic lecture.
- (3) The Candidates are required to know about the method and technique of research work done in the respective field.
- (4) The training requires in such a pattern so as to be given graded responsibility in management and treatment of patients entrusted to his care and to deal emergencies.
- (5) The candidate should be required to participate in the teaching and training programmes of Under-Graduate students or interns in their subjects.
- (6) In the first year period the emphasis should be given adequate knowledge in the applied aspects of the fundamental of the subjects of Ayurveda and adequate training in the basic science of medicine in all its applied and comparative aspects relevant to the specialty concerned with special reference to the basic science of the fundamentals of Ayurveda.

- (7) The Clinical training should aim to extend the knowledge of the candidate to undertake independent work as a specialist.
- (8) The thorough and intensive on planned programme should be given to the students during all stages of the course and such programme should be available for the inspection and scrutiny of the Central Council of Indian Medicine.

8. Examination and assessment:-

- (1) The Post –Graduate degree course shall have two examinations in the following manner:-
- (a) the preliminary examination shall be conducted at the end of one academic year after admission;
 - (b) the final examination shall be conducted on completion of two academic years after passing preliminary examination;
 - (c) examination shall ordinarily be held in the month of June or July and November or December every year;
 - (d) for being declared successful in the examination, student shall have to pass all the subjects separately in preliminary examination;
 - (e) the result of student shall be announced as pass or fail only;
 - (f) if a student fails in one subject only in preliminary examination he/she shall have to pass in that subject before he/she is allowed to appear in the final Examination;
 - (g) if the student fails in theory or practical in the final examination, he/she can appear in the subsequent examination without requiring to submit a fresh dissertation; and
 - (h) the post-graduate degree shall be conferred after the dissertation is accepted and the student passes the final examination.

- (2) The examination shall be aimed to test the clinical acumen, ability and working knowledge of the student in the practical aspect of the specialty and his/her fitness to work independently as a specialist.
- (3) The clinical examination shall aim at a careful assessment of the competence of the student, so that his/her familiarity with Ayurved and scientific literature in the specialty could be judged.
- (4) The viva-voce part of the practical examination shall involve extensive discussion on any aspect of the specialty.

9. Subject of examination:-

- (1) The preliminary examination at the end of one academic year after admission shall be conducted in the following subjects:-
- (a) medical statistics and research methodology;
- (b) fundamentals of non-clinical subjects of Ayurveda with an emphasis on aspects along with relevant studies of basic sciences of modern medicine.

Or

Fundamentals of clinical subjects of Ayurveda with emphasis on applied aspects along with relevant studies of basic sciences of modern medicine.

- (2) The student shall have to undergo training in the department concerned and shall maintain month-wise record of the work done during the last two years of study in the specialty opted by him/her as under:-“
- (i) study of literature related to specialty,
- (ii) regular clinical training in the hospital,
- (iii) practical training of research work carried out in the department,
- (iv) active participation in various seminars, symposia and discussions,
- (v) finalization of topic of dissertation and synopsis,

(vi) the assessment of the work done during the first year on the above points shall be done at the time of preliminary examination;

(3) The final examination being conducted at the end of two academic years shall consist of:

(a) dissertation;

(b) written papers; and

(c) clinical, oral and practical examination, as the case may be.

(4) There shall be four theory papers in each specialty and one practical or clinical and viva-voce examination in the concerned specialty or group of sub-specialties selected by the student for special study.

10. Scheme of examination:-

The scheme of preliminary examination and final examination to be followed in practical, clinical and oral examination shall be as follows:-

(1) The examiners shall not be appointed for a period of more than three years at a time and may be re-appointed after an interval of two years.

(2) The examiner shall possess teaching experience of five years post-graduate teaching.

(3) Medium of instructions shall be Hindi, Sanskrit or English.
